SUBJECT: INVITATION FOR COMMENTS - NEW BSE SECURITIES CODE ISSUANCE STANDARDS

- 1. The BSE hereby informs listed companies, market participants and the general public that the Exchange is in the process of updating standards for the allocation of BSE Codes for securities listed and registered on the bourse.
- 2. The BSE Codes issuance standards are being updated as part of the BSE's upgrade of its infrastructure including the new Central Securities Depository System (CSD), the update to the Automated Trading System and the introduction of the Data Reporting System and will result in a consistent format being applied and reflected across all our systems and reports including the BSE Daily Market Report.
- In line with international practice by Stock Exchanges across the globe, the BSE has adopted its unique internal standard to allocate BSE Codes in a well-defined, uniform and a consistent manner leading to a systematic and clatter free framework.
- 4. The proposed format and attributes of the revised BSE Codes:

CHARACTER	DESCRIPTION
Short-name	A combination of between two (2) and four (4) alphanumeric
combinations	characters which may represent the Issuers' name, e.g. G4S for G4S Botswana Limited, or ABSA for ABSA Bank Botswana Limited, FCP for Far Property Company Limited. The Issuer will be allowed to submit their preferred combination, however the BSE reserves the right to deny the request and allocate an appropriate combination.
Dash sign	A dash sign (-) after the first three or four characters as applicable.
Security type letters	The dash (-) sign, shall be followed by three (3) letters representing the type of security e.g. EQO - for Ordinary Shares,

	EQU - for Linked Units/Variable Loan Stock for Property Companies, GVB - for Government Bonds, CRB - for Corporate Bonds, SPB - for Supranational Bonds, QGB - for Quasi Government Bonds, RTS - for Rights, ETF – for Exchange Traded Funds, CIU - For Collective Investment Undertakings etc.
Debt security identifier	In case of Debt Securities, there shall be a dash (-) character after the type of Instrument followed by a 4-digit numeric identifier for the maturity month and year , and finally another dash (-) followed by a numeral that represents the Series number of the security.

SeedCo International Limited	SEEDCO RIGHTS	SCIL-RTS	8 alphanumeric characters, a combination of between two (2) and four (4) letters of the Issuers' name, a dash and 3 letters representing the security class (RTS – Rights Issued)
Government of Botswana OR Botswana Government	BW	BW-GVB- 0527-16	13 alphanumeric characters, a combination of between two (2) and four (4) letters of the Issuers' name, a dash, 3 letters representing the security class (GVB – Government Bond), 4 digits' numeric identifier 0325 for the maturity month and year i.e. 0527 means May 2027, a dash and 16 being the Series Number that shows where in the Issuer's chronological debt security issuance order the security falls.
International Finance Company	IFC	IFC-SPB- 0924-1	11 alphanumeric characters, a combination of between two (2) and four (4) letters of the Issuers' name, a dash, 3 letters representing the security class (SPB – Supranational Bond), 4 digits' numeric identifier 0924 for the maturity month and year i.e. 0924 means September 2024, a dash and 1 being the Series Number that shows where in the Issuer's chronological debt security issuance order the security falls.
Debt Participation Capital Funding Limited	DPCF	DPCF-QGB- 0622-6	12 alphanumeric characters, a combination of between two (2) and four (4) letters of the Issuers' name, a dash, 3 letters representing the security class (QGB – Quasi Government Bond), 4 digits' numeric identifier 0622 for the maturity month and year i.e. 0622 means June 2022, a dash and 6 being the Series Number that shows where in the Issuer's chronological debt security issuance order the security falls.
